LECTURES SERIES (2022-2023):

- On the occasion of World Anthropology Day, 17th February 2022, Anthropos India Foundation organized a panel discussion on the "Anthropology of Children." The panel featured Dr. Satish Ranjan, Molecular Immunologist and COVID-19 Advisor to the Government of India; Mr. Amitabh Srivastava, a senior journalist; Ms. Malvika Joshi, a storyteller and cultural expert; and Dr. Garima Dalal, Assistant Professor at JNU.

The discussion was enriched by the contributions of guest speakers including Prof. Shalina Mehta, Prof. Amitabh Pande, Prof. Rajni Lamba, Dr. Nemmthian Guite, and Prof. A.K. Sinha, conversation.

- Dr. Aravinda Meera Guntupalli, Senior Lecturer in Global Health at the Institute of Applied Health Sciences, School of Medicine, Medical Sciences, and Nutrition, University of Aberdeen, Scotland, United Kingdom, delivered a lecture at AIF titled "Complex Association Between Migration and Nutrition" on 3rd April 2023. Her talk delved into the intricate relationships between migration patterns and nutritional health, providing insights into how global health who shared their perspectives and added depth to the

 - Professor Amareswar Galla, PhD, UNESCO Chair on Inclusive and Sustainable Heritage Development at Anant National University, Ahmedabad, India, and Emeritus Faculty at the University of Queensland, Australia, delivered a lecture on 7th May 2023. His talk explored the intersections of heritage, sustainability, and inclusivity within contemporary global contexts.
 - As part of the Lecture Series on the International Day for Disaster Risk Reduction (IDDRR) Webinar on “Children & DRR,” held on 13th October 2022, AIF hosted a National Symposium in collaboration with Save the Children India, CRY India, and the Center for Social Equity and Inclusion. The symposium brought together eminent speakers from the Bihar Disaster Series to address the challenges and concerns related to child protection and disaster risk reduction.  - In commemoration of the International Day for Disaster Risk Reduction on 15th October 2022, a distinguished panel of experts participated in a discussion on disaster risk reduction and child protection. The speakers included Mr. Anil Kumar Sinha, IAS (Retd.), Gargi Saha, Child Protection Specialist at UNICEF, Dr. Javed Rashid, Faculty from the University of Kashmir, Sarabjeet Singh Sahota, Disaster Risk Reduction Specialist at UNICEF, and Dr. Sunita Reddy, Founder and Chairperson of AIF. They shared valuable insights on the intersection of child protection and disaster risk management, highlighting the need for issues.
 - Dr. Narasimhan, Associate Professor of Anthropology at the Department of Liberal Arts, IIT Hyderabad, delivered a lecture on “Medical Anthropology in the New Millennium: Recent Developments in the Field” (23 December 2022). Her research interests include medical anthropology, media and gender, and her talk focused on the evolving trends in medical anthropology and their relevance to contemporary issues.

WORKSHOPS (2022-2023)

At AIF, we identified the need for courses on ethnography, fieldwork methods, and academic writing tailored for young researchers, students, and faculty. Our goal was to equip scholars with both traditional fieldwork techniques and introduce them to modern approaches in these fields. Driven by a desire to promote academic writing and help scholars navigate the peer review process and publication journey, we initiated the organization of workshops. Given the challenges posed by the pandemic and our aim to reach as many students as possible, AIF made these workshops accessible virtually.

Esteemed faculty from universities across India contributed to this effort, delivering insightful lectures on a variety of topics. The positive response from students and scholars nationwide validated our efforts and reinforced the importance of such initiatives.

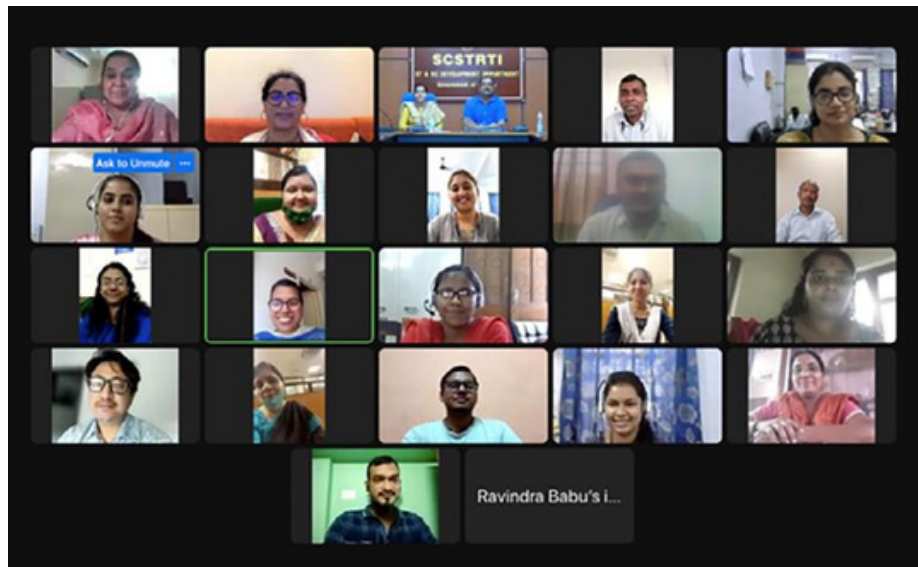
- Anthropos India Foundation held an online workshop on “Understanding and Applying Anthropological Theories” from 11th July 2022 to 16th July 2022. The workshop attracted students, researchers, and young faculty members from across India. Over the course of four days, the workshop provided a comprehensive review of the major theoretical approaches that define the discipline of anthropology. Senior faculty members delivered lectures on evolutionism, diffusionism, functionalism, structuralism, interpretive and symbolic anthropology and postmodernism. By focusing on key schools of thought and prominent theorists, the workshop offered participants a critical understanding of these theories and equipped them with the skills to propose their own theories in their research.

- A seven-week Training Program on Research Methods and Report Writing was organized by the ~~Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes Research and Training Institute (SCSTRTI)~~, Government of Odisha, and Anthropos India Foundation (AIF), with support from the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Government of India. The program ran from 18th July 2022 to 23rd August 2022. The training, which saw participation from 55 personnel across 23 Tribal Research Institutes (TRIs) in the country, was conducted every alternate day of the week. Under the guidance of Prof. A.B. Ota, Director & Special Secretary of SCSTRTI, and Dr. Sunita Reddy, Chairperson of AIF, the program aimed to enhance the skills of TRI personnel in research methods, report writing, and presentation.



Dr. Navaljit Kapoor, Joint Secretary, MoTA, inaugurated the program with an encouraging address. Experts from various institutions, including Prof. Sanghmitra Acharya (JNU), Prof. Ramesh C. Gaur (NSD), Prof. Vaishna Narang (Retd., JNU), Dr. E. Kannan, Dr. Sunita Reddy, Dr. Nemthianngai Guite, Dr. Garima Dalal (JNU), Dr. Prashant Khattri (University of Allahabad), and Dr. Chakraverti Mahajan (University of Delhi), led the sessions. The capacity- building training provided a foundational understanding of both quantitative and qualitative research methods, proposal writing, report writing, and presentation skills. Participants were equipped with various research methods, tools, and data collection techniques to enhance their research capabilities.



- On 10th November 2022, AIF collaborated with BUDS organization to host a one-day workshop focused on community engagement for child safety. The workshop aimed to sensitize civil society and raise awareness about child rights. The session was moderated and co-chaired by Dr. Prof. R.N. Srivastava, Advisor at ICANCL and IAP, and Dr. Yogesh Sarin, Immediate Past President of the Indian Association of Pediatric Surgeons. Discussions covered various topics under the National Health Mission (NHM), including rights-based needs for newborns, early child care, breastfeeding, weaning, malnutrition, anemia, and vaccinations. Dr. Prof. Uma Nayak, Chair Elect of ICANCL, also contributed to the workshop.
- On 29th June 2023, AIF organized a workshop on Digital Ethnography. The workshop highlighted the importance of digital ethnography in uncovering how technology mediates human relationships, shapes social networks, and transforms cultural practices. It provided researchers with insights into the diverse ways digital life influences and intersects with contemporary social phenomena.

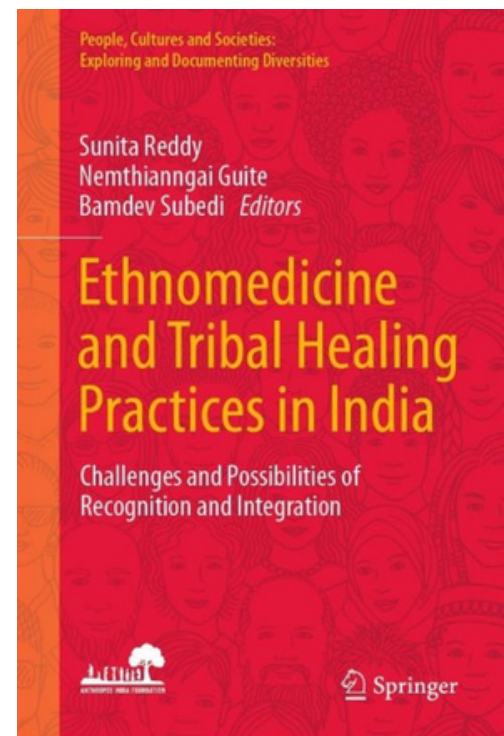
PUBLICATIONS

The book **Caste, COVID, and Inequality** by Prof. Sanghmitra Acharya and Dr. Steven, published by Springer in collaboration with Anthropos India Foundation, has been released. This book is part of the series **People, Cultures, and Societies: Exploring and Documenting Diversities**. The release occurred during the South Asia Women's Conference, held on 27-28th May 2022, which was organized by the Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences and KIIT.



Ethnomedicine and Tribal Healing Practices in India: Challenges and Possibilities of Recognition and Integration, edited by Dr. Sunita Reddy, Nemthianngai Guite, and Bamdev Subedi, explores the role of tribal healing practices in healthcare. Published by Springer Singapore (February 2023), the book features research by anthropologists, sociologists, and public health experts across India.

It examines non-codified folk healing traditions, addressing issues like legitimacy, recognition, intellectual property rights, and sustainable use of medicinal herbs. The book provides insights for students and researchers in medical anthropology, public health, and tribal studies, emphasizing the potential of integrating ethnomedicine into mainstream healthcare systems.



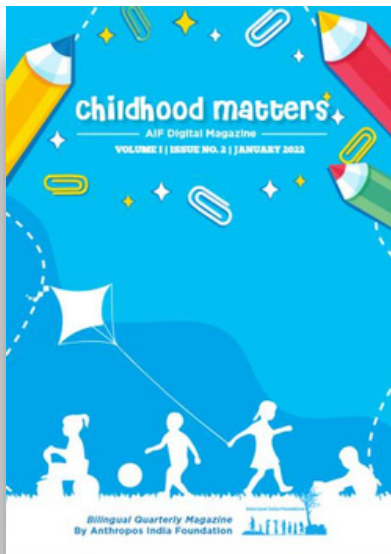

It examines how various contexts and policies influence the definition and protection of children. The edited volume includes contributions from experts in child rights, law, judiciary, activism, and academia, including sociology, anthropology, psychology, and social work. Based on extensive research and practice, the book aims to provide insights and solutions for researchers, policymakers, practitioners, and educators dealing with child protection and rights issues.

Anthropos India Foundation (AIF) is dedicated to advancing the understanding and application of anthropology in India. With a focus on action-oriented research, AIF addresses social issues by applying ethnographic methods and respecting local knowledge, culture, and ecology. Unlike other anthropological associations that focus on networking and seminars, AIF emphasizes applied research, particularly in the areas of public health, gender, and children's issues. AIF aims to tackle disparities in India's stratified society, particularly among vulnerable populations like women, children, and the elderly. The foundation uses research to understand local contexts and traditional wisdom, and then applies culturally appropriate solutions. Key focus areas include addressing child abuse, violence against women, and the welfare of marginalized groups, such as urban slum dwellers and tribal communities in the Northeast engaged in traditional healing practices.

AIF also empowers researchers through training programs and guest lectures, helping them gain new perspectives on tackling social issues. Economic empowerment, particularly for women, is a key priority, with initiatives to promote digital knowledge, banking, and renewable energy solutions. Recently, Anthropos India Foundation became a key supporting partner of the United India Anthropology Forum (UIAF), contributing to the development of anthropological research and training programs for young professionals.
